



Bureau Chief, Ohio Fire Academy – Division of the State Fire Marshal

A native of West Virginia, Mr. King joined the Ohio Department of Commerce, Division of State Fire Marshal, in 2022 as Deputy Director and Chief of the Ohio Fire Academy. Prior to this role, he spent 13 years working for various state agencies, including the Department of Natural Resources and the Department of Public Safety/Ohio Emergency Management Agency. During that time, he led Statewide Emergency Operations and Response Teams, Radiation Safety Teams, HazMat Assessment Teams, and All-Hazards Incident Management Teams.

Mr. King brings 35 years of experience in the fire, EMS, emergency management, and public safety sectors. He has served as both a volunteer and full-time firefighter and EMT in West Virginia, Ohio, and Minnesota, most recently holding the position of Fire Chief and Emergency Management Director for Carver Fire and Rescue. He has also been deployed nationally on multiple tactical and special response teams for major incidents and disasters across the United States.

He holds a Bachelor of Science in Biology from West Virginia University, as well as a Bachelor of Science in Disaster Emergency Management and Fire Science from Columbia College. He also earned a Master of Science in Homeland Security Management from Columbia Southern University. Fire Program Specialist (Ret), Federal Emergency Management Agency

Mr. Dunne is a 28-year veteran of the Fire Service. He has retired from a career department where he served for 25 years. He served in the positions of Firefighter, Fire Apparatus Engineer, Company Officer and Fire Marshal. He was also a licensed Fire Investigator and Paramedic. He is a retired member of Local 439 IAFF a member of the Elgin Retired Firefighters and a member of the Retired Firefighters of Illinois.

Mr. Dunne then served for 12 years with the Department of Homeland Security (DHS)/Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) as a Fire Program Specialist. In this role he aided fire departments to access funding to the Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) program within FEMA's Region 5 and Region 10.

Mr. Dunne also served in the United States Air Force Reserve (USAFR), in the communications and medical career fields. Ms. Kimberly Verdone is a 34-year veteran of higher education. She joined Youngstown State University in 2014 as Director of Degree Audit, Transfer Articulation, and Academic Credit Transfer. Initially serving under the Office of the Provost, her role transitioned to the Office of the Registrar in 2021. In this capacity, she oversees a range of academic programs including Prior Learning Assessment and Transfer Articulation Agreements, and serves as YSU's liaison to the Ohio Department of Higher Education on matters of transfer credit, policy, and compliance.

Charlie Dixon, Captain (Retired), brings over 48 years of combined volunteer and career fire service experience. He is currently an Ohio Certified Fire and Emergency Services Instructor II, Live Fire Instructor, and Firefighter II. Charlie holds an Associate Degree of Technical Study in Fire and EMS Services. He teaches part-time at the Wayne County Regional Fire Training Facility and serves on the advisory boards for Public Safety Training at both Eastland-Fairfield Career & Technical Schools and C-TEC Career and Technology Centers of Licking County.

Throughout his career, Charlie has held multiple specialized roles including Certified Fire Safety Inspector, fire/arson investigation team member, and HazMat team member. He served as a volunteer firefighter and Advanced EMT with the Bladensburg Fire District, rising to the rank of Lieutenant. From 1987 to 2002, he served with the Granville Volunteer Fire Department as a firefighter, EMS provider, Lieutenant, Captain, and EMS Coordinator. He taught Fire and EMS courses for Knox County JVS and the former Licking County JVS, and has instructed at fire schools across Ohio, Pennsylvania, and West Virginia. Charlie is a former Triage Paramedic, Hospital EMS Coordinator, Fire Training Officer II, and Fire Training Supervisor at the Ohio Fire Academy. He later worked for the City of Columbus Division of Fire as a civilian EMS educator, training recruits and on-duty companies.

Now in his third term on the Ohio Fire Council, Charlie represents the flammable liquids industry and also serves as President of the Ohio Society of Fire Service Instructors. He received the 2024 Fire Educator Lifetime Achievement Award from the Ohio Division of EMS. Alongside 20+ years in the oil and natural gas industry, Charlie has developed training props and materials for oil and gas safety programs at the Wayne County Regional Training Facility, where nearly 1,800 firefighters have trained since 2001. He is a Fire and Industry Content Advisor for the Ohio Natural Energy Institute's GOSAFER program and helps lead safety training for first responders and industry workers. In 2025, he was honored with the first-ever Charlie Dixon Excellence in Safety Awareness Award and continues to promote oil and gas careers through career fairs.

Joseph Mistovich, M.Ed, NRP

**Professor Emeritus, Department Chair (Ret),
Youngstown State University**

Joseph Mistovich, Professor Emeritus, retired as Chairperson of the Department of Health Professions and as a Professor at Youngstown State University in Youngstown, Ohio, after 35 years of faculty service. For the first 11 years, he served as the EMS Program Director before becoming Chairperson of the Department. Throughout his tenure as Chairperson, he continued teaching EMS courses every semester until his retirement. He frequently teaches EMS education at the EMR, EMT, Advanced EMT, and Paramedic levels and continues to present at EMS conferences. He also remains active on professional boards and committees related to emergency medical services.

During his time at Youngstown State University, he received numerous honors including the Watson Award, the Chairperson Leadership Award, two Distinguished Professorship Awards in Teaching, a Distinguished Professorship Award in Research and Scholarship, and was the inaugural recipient of the Distinguished Chairperson Award for Excellence in Scholarship, which recognizes outstanding scholarship while serving as a department chair. He holds a Master of Education degree from Kent State University, a Bachelor of Science in Applied Science in Allied Health, and an Associate in Applied Science in Emergency Medical Services, both from Youngstown State University.

He has authored fifteen EMS textbooks and more than fifty journal articles on EMS topics. Mistovich served on the Board of Directors for the Committee on Accreditation of Educational Programs for the EMS Professions (CoAEMSP)—the national accrediting body for EMS programs—for over nineteen years. He currently serves as a Reader, providing executive analyses of self-studies, and as a Program Action Team Member for CoAEMSP. Additionally, he has participated on numerous National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) committees related to Department of Transportation national curriculum revisions and was one of eight group leaders responsible for developing the National EMS Education Standards. He has also contributed to many National Registry of EMT projects, where he continues to assist with special initiatives.
